Through SONY TRANS COM, Inc. selections have been featured periodically on the In-Flight programming of USAIR and other airlines. **On Time** is also programmed by Jerrold Communications on several DAC channels in the United States and by Cody-Leach J-Wave on the *Saint Giga* channel in Japan. **On Time** has received national radio airplay, often as a featured release and has been included on the syndicated radio programs *Echoes*, *Musical Starstreams*, and *Sound Currents of the Earth*.

Presented by its creator, Leslie Kaminoff, at the International Unity in Yoga Conference in Marin County, California.
